MRS. ABSALOM W. COX died at her home in Eden Township, three miles northeast of Davis City, on Wednesday, Nov. 8, 1899. The deceased was born in Anderson County, Tennessee, June 6, 1830, where she lived until grown, then moved with her parents to Mercer County, Mo. Her maiden name was LIENALLEN. While residing in Mercer County, she was married to ABSALOM W. COX in the year, '55, and from there they moved to this county where she has since resided. Sister COX was the mother of eight children, five boys and three girls, her husband and two sons having preceded her to the Great Beyond. The rest of the children were all present at the funeral.

Brother A.W. COX was widely known as a Minister of the Gospel and died Aug. 30, 1893. Sister COX united with the Bethel Baptist church in 1855, and remained a faithful member until death. Her death came suddenly Wednesday morning while her son,

**FRANK and wife, were out to milk. On their return to the houe they found her lying on the floor with life almost extinct, and death came in spite of all that could be done.**

**The funeral services were held at Bethel Church by Rev. Harry A. Bennett, after which her remains were laid to rest in the church cemetery. The sorrowing relatives, and the children, who fully realize that they have lost their best earthly friend, have the deepest sympathy of their many friends and neighbors.**

### LIEUALLEN

William Lieuallen was Josiah Lieuallen's brother. William came to the valley in 1864 and homesteaded southeast of Weston. The homestead became the first Century Farm in Umatilla County, in 1968, and is located on Lieuallen Road. One line of family farmers continued with William's son, James P. Lieuallen (1867-1935). Next was his son, James E. Lieuallen, Sr., and his wife, Audrey; then to their son, James E. Lieuallen, Jr., who now farms half of the original homestead. James E. Lieuallen, Jr.'s son, Michael Lieuallen lives on the homestead.

Another son of William's, Thomas Asbury Lieuallen, continued his lineage of farmers through his son, Otis Lieuallen, and then Otis' sons: Don, Robert and Russell, who farm the other half of the original homestead. The three men also farm in the Adams area and pasture land they own on Pine Creek became a Century Farm in 1993. They operate as D & R & R Lieuallen and grow wheat, green peas and alfalfa hay.

Mrs. Lieuallen came to Weston as early as 1864, before a single house had been built on the town's present site.**

**The Journal of William Lieuallen, emigrant of 1864**

**Pioneer Family of the Month - September 1996**

**William T. Lieuallen and his bride, Margaret Fuson, were married the day before they set off from the Fuson home to get ready for the trip to Oregon. William was the middle child of eleven children born to Peyton and Jemima Lieuallen in Anderson County, Tennessee. In 1843 or '44, following the birth of their last child, Peyton and Jemima moved the family to Missouri. After moving to Missouri, the Lieuallen boys just sort of kept on going -- all but one of Peyton and Jemima's sons emigrated to the Pacific Northwest. Only John Wesley Lieuallen and the four Lieuallen daughters -- Mary Ann, Rebecca Jane, Julieann, and Sarah -- stayed in the East.**

**William was a latecomer to Oregon. Most of his brothers and several family friends had emigrated in earlier years, so William and Margaret had a firm destination in mind when they set out. The Lieuallen homesteads in eastern Oregon were well short of the Willamette Valley, but by 1864 that no longer mattered nearly as much as it had only 20 years before. Gold had lured prospectors to the dry side of the Cascade Mountains by then, and boom towns, ranches, and respectable settlers had inevitably followed. There were stores and small towns stretching well into Nebraska and Idaho, shortening the trip through unsettled lands still claimed by Indian tribes.**

**Still, traveling the Oregon Trail in 1864 was a serious undertaking, and William was inspired to risk the trip to get away from wartime conditions in the East. A letter from John Wesley Lieuallen to his brother Josiah, who had emigrated to Oregon the year before, dated August 30, 1864 -- while brother William was camped along the Snake River en route to Oregon -- described conditions as, "very troublesome here, and so they were [before you left for Oregon], but nothing to compare with what they are now.**



And they get worse every day, my language fails me to tell how low and degraded the people have got, mind cannot think of anything too mean for them to do. ...there has been murdering and stealing all around us."

On his journey west, William kept a journal, recording the daily conditions and keeping a record of his mileage as best as he could reckon. Note that this is not a diary - William rarely if ever recorded his personal feelings or detailed information except where it pertained to the wagons, livestock, and traveling conditions. This is not unusual in records kept by the menfolk; women were more likely to keep diaries than impersonal journals. The text of the journal was taken from family annals shared with the End of the Oregon T

After meeting his older brother, Thomas Tyndall Lieuallen, at his claim, William and his brother Noah immediately set about finding their own land. This took less than a week, and by October William was hard at work building the cabin in which he and Margaret would spend their first winter in Oregon. Aside from the occasional trip into town, a few days off to help friends and relatives raise their cabins, and two or three days spent husking corn for his brother, William worked for about three weeks to build his cabin, and a further two weeks building a stone chimney. William and Margaret finally moved into their new house on December 8, 1864, after William finished the hearth and put in a wood plank floor. This was fairly ambitious as first-year cabins went, but with his brothers already established nearby, William didn't have to worry about securing food, tools, and other supplies he and Margaret would need to build a home.

William chose to stake his claim on sloping, hilly ground because he found a spring and small stream, and he considered the presence of year-round water important enough to prefer the foothills of the Blue Mountains over the prairie on the valley floor. This choice proved to be a wise one, as he and his family prospered and expanded their land holdings over the years. In 1875, William built a proper frame house for his growing family. Lieuallen family lore holds that William wasn't much of a carpenter, as evidenced in the photograph of the barn he built for his livestock (no word of who the buckeroo in the foreground is), so hopefully he used hired hands for most of the labor. Sadly, the home of William and Margaret Lieuallen burned to the ground on January 8, 1987, its wood-shingled roof apparently set ablaze by sparks from the chimney. Fortunately, no one was killed or injured, but the family lost many precious heirlooms and photographs in the fire.

**OBITUARY - GEORGE W. BLAKESLEY.**

**Decatur County Journal**

**February 16, 1899**

**GEORGE W. BLAKESLEY was born in Vermillion County, Indiana, July 20, 1833, and died at his home in Decatur County, Iowa, February 9, 1899, aged 65 years, 6 months and 18 days.**

**He moved with his parents to Appanoose County, Iowa, when about 14 years of age and from there to this county in the early 50s. He was married to REBECCA JANE LIEWELLEN in Mercer County, Missouri, November 26, 1856.**

**To this union were born four children, all of whom survive him.**

He united with the Baptist Church at New Salem and was baptized by Rev. Elmore in 1862, since which time he has lived a consistent Christian life and died in the blessed hope of life beyond the grave. He was a man of great energy, kind hearted and generous, always cheerful and hopeful under the severest trials of life. He will be missed in the home, in the church, in the community, and mourned by all who knew him. He leaves a wife, four children and twenty-one grandchildren.

Funeral services were conducted by D.J. Hullinger, after which he was laid to rest in the New Salem Cemetery to await the trumpet's sound on the resurrection morning.

Moscow (Hog Heaven; Paradise Valley)

In 1871 the Lieuallen brothers, Asbury and Noah, and around 20 other families arrived in the valley. Drawn by the abundant grassland and availability of timber for building, they established their homes. They first called the area Hog Heaven and later renamed it Paradise Valley. With the establishment of the business district in 1875, the town, by then called Moscow, began developing as a trading center. The coming of the Oregon Railroad & Navigation Company's rail line (now Union Pacific) in 1885 touched off a migration that boosted the young town's population to 2000 in 1890. In 1889, the year before Idaho became a state, the decision to locate the University of Idaho at Moscow gave new impetus to Moscow's growth. A second railroad line, the Northern Pacific, reached the town in 1890

One of the earliest settlers in Latah county was Asbury Lieuallen. The section, of which Moscow is now the center, had been given the name of Paradise valleey, and the appellation was not inappropriate. The hills and undulating prairies were very attractive, while their mantle of native grasses prophesied the wonderful richness of the soil that after years have demonstrated. Mr. Lieuallen, in March of 1871, camped in this valley, and, impressed with its advantages, determined to take up a land claim and establish his home there. ...

The homestead taken up by Mr. Lieuallen is about three miles east of Moscow. There he farmed for a few years and other settlers established tehmselves in the vicinity-- probably a score.

**The Almon Asbury Lieuallen House was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1978. Located at 101 S. Almon St. in Moscow, Idaho in Latah County the house was built in 1884. The structure has a mansard roof and two-story bays on either side of the entrance. The structure originally had a smaller covered porch, and the bays were more visible than at present. A small railed balcony atop the porch was accessible by a door on the second floor. That door has been replaced by a window, and the porch expanded to cover the entire east side of the facade. Additional dormer windows have been added on the third floor to provide additional lighting and ventilation for the top floor.[2] The structure has always been used as a residence, first as a family home, then as apartments. It is currently used as multi-family apartments.[1]**

**The wooden structure was built outside the town of Moscow on his farm and occupied by Almon Asbury Lieuallen and his family.[3] One of the early settlers of Moscow, he operated one of the first stores and was postmaster in 1876. Together with James Deakin, Henry McGregor, and John Russell, he donated one-quarter of the one-hundred and twenty acres which became the city center of Moscow.[4]**
